



MAKE THE CUB SCOUT SIGN

Make the sign with your right hand and with your arm held straight up. The two fingers stand for the Scout Oath and the Scout Law. They look like a wolf's ears ready to listen to Akela. Give the Cub Scout Sign when you say the Scout Oath or Scout Law.

SHOW THE CUB SCOUT HANDSHAKE

The handshake is done by putting the index and middle fingers of the right hand against the other person's wrist when shaking hands.



Cub Scouts and Cub Scout leaders use this handshake everywhere in the United States. The handshake signifies that those who use it help others and obey the Scout Oath and Law.
